Lady Marilyn and I traveled to Puerto Rico on June 22, 2011 to attend the American Baptist Churches (ABC) Biennial Convention and Board Meeting as delegates representing Pilgrim.

From the time we arrived, we heard the word, "hola," which means "hello" or "hi" in Spanish. The citizens of Puerto Rico greeted us with love.

The ABC Churches of Puerto Rico were our hosts for the eight days of meetings and chose the theme, "Let's Celebrate!" This theme was prophetic, as celebrations rang out over the entire island!

We were trapped on a 15-passenger taxi van for three hours from the San Juan Airport to our hotel because of a parade celebrating an NBA star from the Dallas Mavericks. We met another celebration via the welcoming bands that serenaded us at the Puerto Rico Convention Center.

We felt God's presence during the celebrative praise and worship led by several Puerto Rican women during our daily multi-cultural worship services. The ABC celebration was taken to yet another level as the youth at First Baptist Church of Carolina, Puerto Rico praised God during four

Our meetings were inclusive, diverse (*with world-wide delegates*), and affirming. Everyone on the island and in the denomination welcomed each other in celebrating the love of Jesus Christ. It felt like what heaven will be like.

I was particularly encouraged that we elected a female president of the ABC Board, Ruth Green from Kansas—a music teacher, pastor's wife, and an humble servant leader. I will look forward to working alongside her as a fellow ABC board member.

Truly, I have found a home at Pilgrim as Pastor and Servant Leader and as an ABC Denominational Leader. I pray that our Pilgrim membership will get involved in the many ministries that ABC offers on all levels.

Thank you for allowing Lady Marilyn and me to represent you in this way. We have much to celebrate as Christians regardless of which denominations we embrace. God loves us all and gives us the privilege to spread His love to all people. Thanks also to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, I can truly celebrate even while I am in a travel jam!
